How can a General Welder apprentice benefit my business?

Who is the General Welder apprenticeship for?

The General Welder apprenticeship is aimed at those who wish to gain the knowledge and experience required to become a General Welder whilst working in industry. General Welders are needed in a number of sectors, for example, the steelwork construction sector. A General Welder apprentice will work with metals to create high-strength welds in 2 welding positions, using at least 1 arc welding process.


What will it cost the business to take on an apprentice?

Levy-paying employers in England can use funds in their Apprenticeship Service Account to fund apprenticeship training costs.

Non-levy paying employers: The government will fund between 95% - 100%* of the cost of training an apprentice.

*This depends on how many people are employed within the company, the age of the apprentice and also if they have been in care or have a Local Authority Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

Functional Skills

If your apprentice does not hold a GCSE 4/5 or equivalent in English and maths, they will be required to complete functional skills. Delivery options will be agreed upon before the commencement of the apprenticeship.

End Point Assessment

The EPA tests and validates the knowledge, skills and behaviours that an apprentice has gained during their training and demonstrates the competence of an apprentice in their role. This assessment for the General Welder apprenticeship consists of:

- Theoretical knowledge test
- · Practical / oral examination
- Professional interview
